PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Talk to Your Child

Ask your child if there is anything that he would like you to discuss with the teacher. Jot down everything that you want to talk about at the conference.

Be on Time

Arrive promptly or a few minutes early.

Start Off on the Right Foot

Begin with positive comments about the teacher or classroom.

Listen to What the Teacher has to Say

Be open-minded to suggestions from the teacher.

Stay Calm

Keep your emotions under control.

Stay on Track

Avoid lengthy discussions of topics that are not related to the purpose of the conference.

Stay Within Your Conference Time

Do not stay beyond your allotted time.

Show Gratitude

Express appreciation for the conference.

Tell Your Child About What You Discussed

Take notes about what has been discussed to share with your child.



Dear St. Al/St. Pat's Parents:

I'm very pleased to announce that one of the things the Board of Specified Jurisdiction and our school have been working toward will begin next year! The **St. Al/St. Pat's 5-Day Preschool Program** will open with the 2016 school year, and we couldn't be more excited.

The BSJ has long believed that adding a 5-day preschool program will enhance the school's appeal for young families in the area, and will also benefit the school through the added revenue. Of course we are <u>most excited</u> about introducing young children to the benefits of the strong faith community we have at St. Al/St. Pat's and the tremendous opportunity afforded by a Catholic School education.

As with our current three day program, it will be aligned to the Illinois Early Learning Standards and the Archdiocese curriculum. Our five day full day preschool program will allow us the opportunity enhance the curriculum that is already part of our preschool program. Students will get to learn through play, as well as more structured small and large group lessons. (Research indicates that meaningful play helps young children learn best.) Students will learn pre-reading skills, math skills, writing skills, fine and gross motor skills, problem solving skills and much more. The five day program will allow for the opportunity to further enhance the children's skills and will allow more time for the children to experience activities that challenge them at different levels. (More information to come.)

The program will:

- begin and end at the same time as the regular school day: 7:45a.m.-2:15 p.m.
- Morning care: 7:00-7:30 a.m. will be offered, as well as, after school care known as Extended Day from 2:15-6:00 p.m.
- Preschoolers who have siblings that ride the bus will be able to join them on the bus. Due to their age, preschoolers who don't have an older sibling to assist them will not have access to bus services.

We hope you will let your families, friends and neighbors with preschool children know about this new enhancement to our school. Many thanks to Ms. Payne for her hard work and dedication in getting this project off the ground and helping us make it happen!
