

HOW CAN I GET MY KIDS TO DO CHORES?

Here are the Top 10 Tips to get your children to do chores and take responsibility:

- 1. Provide support but don't take over.
- 2. Give more privileges as they become more responsible.
- 3. Let them make as many decisions as possible.
- 4. Teach them what they are supposed to do and how to do it.
- 5. Praise progress along the way, not just accomplishments.
- 6. Notice when they're doing what they're supposed to, not just when they aren't.
- 7. Assign chores that suit their temperament, maturity, and interests.
- 8. Hold them accountable by setting rules and following through on consequences.
- 9. Encourage them to find a place where they can and want to give their all.
- 10. Meet your own responsibilities with a positive attitude.

When children are so busy with school work and extra-curricular activities, you may be reluctant to burden them with household chores. However, research has found that kids who were most successful in school and in life began doing chores at three to four years of age.

At any age chores build a "can-do, want-to-do feeling" that teaches life skills, encourages self-sufficiency, and enables them to contribute to their world.

Through chores, children learn that there are standards they need to live up to and that they will be expected to keep meet their responsibilities. (Taken from the "Center for Parenting Education.")
