



Why are we in school longer than other schools around us?

This question has been posed to either myself or another staff member over the last few weeks. The Illinois State Board of Education requires that every school have at 176 student attendance days. The Archdiocese of Chicago Office of Catholic Schools requires that we have between 178-182 student attendance days. We are also required to have 6-10 religion and staff development days. Individual schools set their own calendars. Thus, schools may have different days off, different start dates, different Christmas and Easter breaks, different professional development days, use of emergency days, etc. The various ways schools set their calendars would be the reason there are different beginning and ending days. In the end we are required to have the same amount of days. I hope this helps answer the question.

Class of 2001 student receives PhD.

Congratulations to Bradley Cesario who recently completed his doctoral program at Texas A&M University. Brad has a PhD. in philosophy with a major in history. Brad began his foundation in education at St. Alphonsus/St. Patrick School in 1992 and graduated in 2001. After St. Al/St. Pat's, Brad graduated from Providence High School. From Providence Brad graduated from U of I at Champaign with a Bachelors degree in History. Brad completed his graduate studies at Texas A&M. In 2013 he received a Masters in History and then graduated from Texas A&M as a Doctor of Philosophy with a major in history.

Bradley has served as a Teaching Assistant and taught for six years in various history classes at Texas A&M. He has done research for his dissertation in England. His research specialized in 19th Century British Navy.

In 2014 Brad presented a paper he authored titled "The Popular Nelson in the Navalist Era, 1889-1914" at the Navy and Nation Conference at the National Maritime Museum in London. He has been invited to present at the British His-

tory Conference in London next week.

Bradley's Professor, R.J.Q. Adams, author and distinguished professor at Texas A & M, is quoted as saying: "Brad should be teaching and is an excellent writer." Bradley attributes his love for writing and research to Mrs. Eileen Bruno, St. Al/St. Pat's eighth grade teacher.
