If your child would like milk with lunch on days he/she does not order a hot lunch, please be sure to place an order for **milk only** on the

online hot lunch order each month...this helps us be sure we have enough on hand. Remember, ordering for October lunches will become available next Tuesday, September 1.

IMPORTANT

PHONE CALLS: Student use of school phones is only done in emergency situations. This is done through the main office. Forgetting a lunch, book, assignment, gym shoes, etc. does not constitute an emergency (although your child may think so). As we strive to teach our students responsibility, I encourage you not to bring to school forgotten items. We don't serve our children well by allowing them to ask you to bring something they have forgotten. Please know that no student will go hungry if he or she forgets a lunch. We are great at sharing. If you notice that your child forgot something and you feel it is necessary to drop it off at school, you can bring it to the main office and we will make every attempt to get it to your child in a timely fashion. Please understand, however, that while we try to do our best, circumstances of the day may prevent delivery during the day. If a child has forgotten a lunch, please **remind them** to check the cart outside the front office to see if their lunch was dropped off.

CELL PHONES: If your child brings a cell phone to school, he/she must keep it turned off and in the backpack. Cell phones are not permitted during school hours or at after school clubs. If a phone is used at an inappropriate time, the phone will be taken to the office and the parent will be asked to pick it up.

ALUMS: We love our alums and love to have them visit. We ask that if they will be visiting teachers that they do so after school or that they feel free to attend Mass with us on Fridays.

NEW THIS YEAR: Due to the vast volume of tardies last year, we have instituted the following: any student late for school three or more times in a trimester will receive a detention notice. Detention is served after school from 2:15-3:00 p.m. All students must be in their classrooms and settled for the school day (i.e. all necessary items taken from their lockers to their seats, etc.). It may be possible that if you have two or more children that one may be marked tardy but not the other two children. This would occur because the child who is tardy wouldn't be in the room or ready to begin the school day. All students are expected to be in their seats when the tardy bell rings at 7:45 a.m.

VACATION AND EARLY DISMISSAL: As instructional time is extremely important, I ask that you plan vacations at times when school is not in session. I also ask that you not take your child out of school before 2:15 p.m. When a student leaves early from school, he/she misses instructional time and any announcements made at the end of the day. It is also disruptive to class being taught.
