


park there—you may be ticketed.

IMPORTANT NITTY GRITTY

UNIFORM

It may not seem like a big deal but coming in a neat, clean, proper school uniform each day says I take pride in myself. At the beginning of each year and periodically throughout the year teachers remind students about the proper uniform. When students don't come in the proper uniform, it is one more thing that teachers need to address. This takes time away from teaching. I am sure you would rather your child receive instruction as opposed to time being wasted discussing proper uniform attire with your child. If you have particular questions regarding school uniforms, please email your child's teacher. I realize sometimes it is a battle with your child to dress neatly and appropriately. Unfortunately for you, this is a battle that needs to be fought at home so it doesn't need to be addressed at school. I'm sure your child (particularly older students) will not be happy with you—it is worth the fight. It's okay to be the bad guy. Feel free to tell your child Ms. Payne said you have to come to school in the proper uniform. If you choose not to, there will be consequences. The uniform doesn't just consist of wearing the proper skirt, jumper, pants and shirts. It also includes socks, haircuts, shoes, jewelry, fingernail polish, bows, ribbons or headbands worn in the hair. It's a good idea to have the children set their clothes out the night before school. I also remind students of this on a regular basis—so you are not alone. Children may wear gym shorts until Sept. 30. On out of uniform days children who wear shorts must be dressed in walking shorts.

ABSENCES AND TARDIES

It is critical that your child be at school on time. You need to allow enough time for your child to be dropped off, get into the building, and get organized for the day. This will help your child start the day off right. If a child is tardy three times, the child will receive a discipline slip. Three discipline slips result in a detention. We do realize due to weather, accidents on the bridge, or something similar that many families are involved in, you may be late getting to school. Your child will not be marked tardy.

When a child is absent, they miss important classroom learning that can't be replicated with a worksheet. It is important that your child understand that you take class time as a very important part of the school experience. The only excused absences are illness, death of a family member, or school related functions. All other absences are considered non-excused. When a child returns to school after being absent, it is his/her responsibility to get the missed work. Upon a child's return, **tests missed on the day of an absence must be made up before or after school or during the child's recess period.** In this way, the child doesn't lose more instruction time.

Last Friday, nine children left early. This may seem insignificant but I assure you it isn't. When a child leaves early, not only do they lose valuable class time, it is also a disruption to teaching and student learning in the class. From now on since grades 4-8 have set class times (switching), any student leaving during class time will not take part in that particular class. They will get their belongings and wait at the front office until they are picked up. In this way, no one else is disrupted. Also, please do not pick your child up between 1:25 and 2:15 (the last class period). I know some parents like to pick their child up during that time so they don't have to wait in the car line. However at the end of the day, in addition to instructional time, many things in the office, in the class-room and throughout the school are occurring—distributing notes to classrooms, making announcements, last directions to students etc.; dismissal is interrupted for other children. If your child should leave early, it is his/her responsibility to turn in work that needed to be turned in that day (even for the class/es not attended) and to find out that night what was missed.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is one of the most important dynamics between teacher and parents. Feel free to email teachers with questions or concerns. Please understand that often teachers will not be able to respond to emails during the day. Their focus is on the lesson, lesson preparation or collaboration with a colleague. When communicating in an email, please choose words carefully to explain your concerns. No one can tell the tone of what is written and sometimes the email is full of emotion that may or may not be correctly interpreted by the staff member receiving the email. Also, if you are angry or frustrated with something that has happened and you have composed an email, it's a good idea to use the 24 hour rule – wait 24 hours before sending it. If there is a lot of emotion behind what you want to speak with the teacher about, please pick up the phone and call the teacher.

Regarding myself and communication, feel free to contact me through emails or phone calls. If you email me and it isn't anything that is confidential and you are comfortable send a copy also to Mrs. Cesario at schooloffice@ stals-stpats.org. She will try to be sure that I receive the email that may need to be responded to that day. If I haven't responded to your email within a few days (I do try to do it within 24 hours.), please call me. It may be that it got missed in literally the hundred of emails I get everyday.
