



## Parent/Legal Guardian Code of Conduct (updated 8/28/07)

St. Alphonsus-St. Patrick School requires that both parents or guardians of every student-athlete read, acknowledge and sign the following code of conduct. I understand that my failure or refusal to sign will result in my child(ren) not participating in school athletics.

### As a parent/guardian of a student-athlete, I:

1. Pledge to have my child on time or early for practices and games. I understand that it is embarrassing for my child to be late to such activities and I am exposing him/her to unnecessary risk by not providing adequate warm-up time. I also understand the importance of timely pick up of my child after all games and practices since it shows respect for the coach and other volunteers who have other time commitments, as well as showing my child that he/she is my top priority.
2. Understand that children play interscholastic sports to have fun, make new friends and learn new skills. I understand that the game is for the children and that I will encourage my child to have fun, keeping the competition in proper perspective at all times. I understand that student-athletes do their best when they are emotionally healthy so I will be positive and supportive of them. During the game I will limit my comments to encouraging my child and other players on both teams. I will not add confusion by yelling out instructions from the stands or sidelines.
3. Will explain what it is to be a "winner" in my conversations with my child. A winner is someone who puts forth maximum effort, continues to learn and improve, and does not let mistakes, or fear of making mistakes, stop them from active participation. I understand that mistakes are an inevitable part of any game, particularly at the elementary and middle school levels, and that people learn from their mistakes. I understand that all children are born with different abilities and that the true measure is not how my child compares to others but how he/she is doing in comparison to his/her best effort.
4. Understand the importance of setting a good example of sportsmanship to my child. No matter what others may do, I will show respect for all involved in the game including coaches, players, opponents, opposing fans, and referees. I understand that I make mistakes in my daily life and I must accept that officials, coaches, and players will do the same. I will demonstrate proper sportsmanship by only making positive comments and will remain silent if I disagree with an official's, coach's, or player's action or decision.
5. Agree to fulfill the volunteer requirements as set forth from time to time by the athletic association board in a positive and supportive manner, realizing that the program, as an all-volunteer organization, will not succeed without the dedicated service of every student-athletes' parents or guardians.
6. Have taken appropriate steps to ensure that my child(ren) are physically and emotionally capable of participating in athletic activity and understand and accept that any sport has inherent risk of injury.

### Parent Expectations and Responsibilities

Parents play an important role in the success of the student-athlete and also in the success of the team.

- Parents are expected to support and encourage their child's efforts. Attending games and cheering the team on is a show of support; however, parents are always reminded to act in a responsible manner and show good Christian sportsmanship.
- Parents should make no attempt to instruct or direct the play of a student-athlete during practices or games. They should not criticize the playing efforts of any student-athlete or of the team.
- Parents should be a model for putting losses in perspective and moving on. Questioning, criticizing, or berating the coach, the referees, or any other official is inappropriate behavior.
- Parents should realize that they will be asked to leave a game if they are not able to maintain a standard of acceptable behavior.
